
Downloading records from Google Scholar

he The record from Google Scholar will be fine for essays but you may want to copy and paste an abstract and/or keywords directly from the article or from another database - Google Scholar works best for journal articles but mistakes do creep in so it always pays to check the final record

if you are using a laptop you may not have the link to EndNote under each record. Click on Google Scholar **Settings** on top right and then scroll to the end of the new page, where you will need to change to **show links to import citations into...EndNote..**then click on **Save** button on the bottom of the page.



• Once your preferences are set to download records into EndNote you can download records into your EndNote library but only one at a time....!
