

# Downloading records from PubMed

You can export references directly into EndNote.

1. Select the results you want to keep, and click on **Send to** at the top of the page.

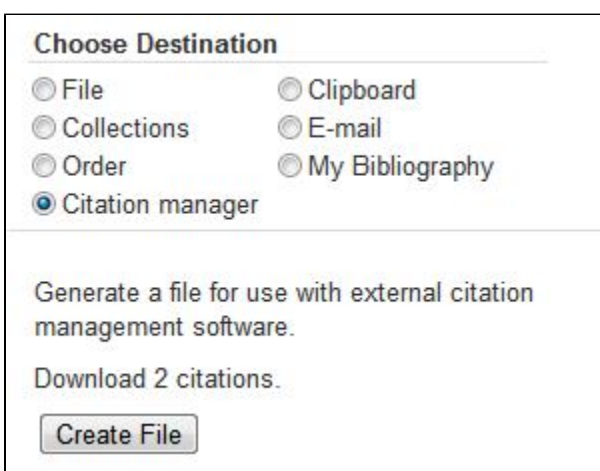

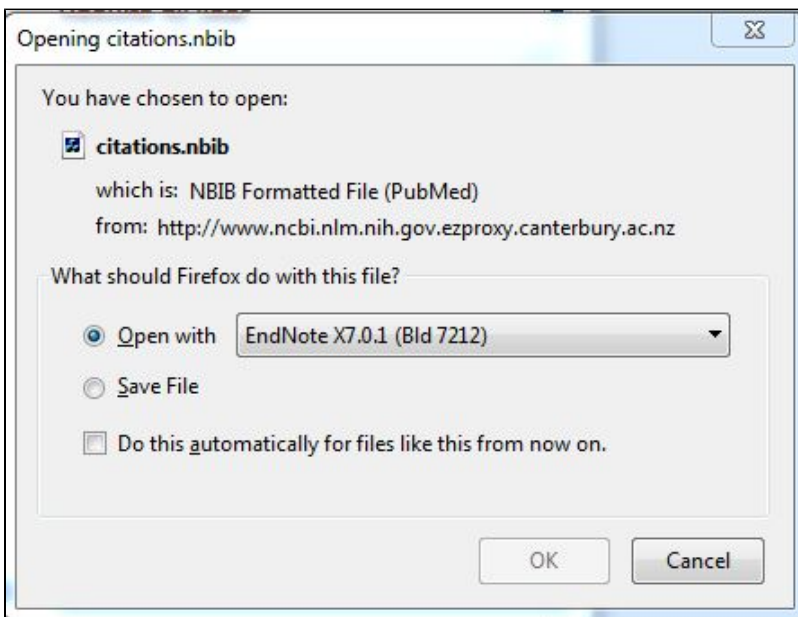
