


# Exporting citations from Google Scholar

You must first configure Google Scholar. Go to Google (<http://scholar.google.com>) and select Scholar Settings  **Settings**, then scroll down to **Bibliography Manager** and click on the radio button **Show links to import citations into**: Click on the pulldown menu and select **EndNote**. Click on the box **Save**.

1. Once you have done your search, you should see **Import into EndNote**. Click on "**Import into EndNote**", then choose to



, then select **GoogleScholar** filter, the record should automatically go to your EndNote Library

Note you have to download Google Scholar filter and save it in **Applications\EndNote X7\Filters** before you can import into EndNote. The filter is available at <http://www.lib.ucdavis.edu/dept/instruc/research/endnote/files/googlescholar.enf>.

2. **A.** If that does not work, you can choose **Save File** or **Download File** to your computer depending your browser. Normally the file should appear in your Downloads folder.

**B.** Open your EndNote Library, click on **File>Import**, then select the **scholar.enw** file you have downloaded and then choose **googlescholar** as the **Import Options** (see below), then click on **Import**, then you should see the reference in your EndNote Library.
